OUTDOOR LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

HIGH SCHOOL

A year-long program that brings together students from diverse economic and cultural backgrounds for an immersive experience including a 5-day wilderness trip and monthly community service projects designed to foster individual growth, increase personal resiliency, and cultivate leadership skills. 




