Explorers is an experiential education program through which we partner with 2nd-5th grade classrooms in the Richmond Public School (RPS) system. Each partner school participates in seven to eight monthly field trips in the Richmond area. These trips incorporate: team-building activities designed to build/help students recognize resilience skills, experiential lessons correlated to Virginia Department of Education Standards of Learning (SOL) science objectives, and nature exploration. Through this program alone, we serve approximately 1,600 students per month and employ 22 part-time staff (September thru May) in support of our organization's two overarching program goals:

- 1. Help children achieve academic success, especially in the sciences, through active outdoor education that is appropriate for their current science curriculum.
- 2. Develop character and leadership through outdoor experiences that expand horizons, increase confidence, and build collaboration skills.
